The meeting was adjourned at 7:50 pm.







SOUTH BOUND 101 Take exit 481B "West 116, Sebastopol-Downtown Cotati"; turn right and travel until you reach Stoney Point Road, turn left Travel that until you see Mecham Road, turn right, travel until you reach Pepper Road, turn right Travel until you reach Bodega Ave, turn right Travel until you reach Fallon Road, turn left Travel down that road for about 2 miles, keep straight Fallon Road will turn into Fallon-Two Rock Road (same road, it's about 3.5 miles total). 

Snood, (It Rhymes with Food)

Snoods date back to Medieval times and were popular during the Civil War. They made a big comeback in the 1940's and were most popular during WWII. The most

common way to wear a snood during the "Rosie the Riveter" days was to pin the snood at the crown of the head and tuck all the rest of the hair inside. The top front hair could be curled, but was always worn away from the face in a soft and wavy style. The rest of the hair was now kept safe from machinery while working. A snood was especially great for a "bad hair" day. And going out after work was easy, as all one had to do was attach a flower or bow to the snood and she was ready. Snoods were often crocheted to match an outfit.



Women's hair during the 1940's was a different issue than today. Soap and water were often scarce and, in some places, rationed. It was recommended that hair washing be done once a week if your hair was exceptionally greasy and every three to four weeks if your hair was dry. Women wrapped their hair brush with gauze bandages so the bristles poked through and brushed their hair for at least five minutes nightly. Lemon juice was used to keep blonde hair bright. Brunettes used vinegar or beer to add shine. And if you needed to dye your hair, rhubarb, chamomile or henna were used. Women wound their hair in rags to get that curly look. Bobby pins were scarce, as the steel was needed for the war effort. Victory pins were used to pin the snood in place, and if you had your hair done at a beauty salon, you had to bring your own pins. And this was also the age of "home perms".


